Kristin is a welcome addition and we look forward to seeing what she can do next. She looks forward to working with you at the Quattro Firm.



THEODOR SEUSS GEISEL ("TED") was born on March 2, 1904, in Springfield, Massachusetts. A doodler at heart, Ted often remarked, with a twinkle in his eye, that he never really learned to draw. His school notebooks often included imaginative creatures that framed sporadic notes he had taken in class.

FOR OVER 60 YEARS, Dr. Seuss's illustrations brought a visual realization to his fantastic and imaginary worlds. However, his artistic talent went far beyond the printed page, as in his Secret Art works – the paintings and sculpture he did at night for himself that he rarely exhibited during his lifetime.
