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MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

The following Management Discussion & Analysis ("MD&A") of Internet of Things Inc. ("the Company" or "ITT Inc.") financial condition and results of operations, prepared as of May 30, 2018, should be read in conjunction with the Company's Condensed Consolidated Financial Statements and accompanying notes for the year ended January 31, 2018, which have been prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards are incorporated by reference herein and form an integral part of this MD&A. All dollar amounts are in Canadian Dollars unless stated otherwise. These documents can be found on the SEDAR website www.sedar.com.

Our MD&A is intended to enable readers to gain an understanding of ITT Inc.'s current results and financial position. To do so, we provide information and analysis comparing the results of operations and financial position for the current year to those of the preceding year. General Overview of Internet of Things Inc.

Internet of Things Inc. ("the Company" or "ITT Inc.") was incorporated on September 27, 1994 as a Junior Capital Pool Company under the rules of the Alberta Securities Act and under the Business Corporations Act (Alberta).

On May 14, 2015 the Company received approval to transfer its listing from the NEX to the TSX Venture Exchange ("TSX-V") following the closing of the Change of Business Transaction between the Company and Double Door Communications Inc. ("Double Door"). In conjunction with the Change of Business (COB), the Company raised a total of \$525,000 in a private placement financing as a convertible debenture and the shares of the Company were listed as a Tier 2 issuer on the TSX-V.

The COB involved the acquisition of all of the issued and outstanding common shares of Double Door by the Company. As consideration, the Company issued an aggregate of 15,000,000 common shares to the former shareholders of Double Door, of which 5,000,000 common shares are subject to a performance escrow agreement between the vendors and the Company.

Concurrently with the closing of the COB, the Company completed a convertible debenture financing of \$525,000 (the "Convertible Debentures"). The Convertible Debentures have a maturity date of two (2) years from the date of issuance and pay interest at the rate of 12% per year, calculated and payable quarterly in arrears. All amounts owing under the Convertible Debentures are secured by a fixed and floating charge against the assets of the Company.

Concurrent with the closing of the COB, Double Door is now a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Company. The Company continued under the Business Corporations Act (Ontario) ("OBCA") and changed its name to Internet of Things Inc. Upon the continuance becoming effective, the Articles of Continuance of the Company under the OBCA replaced the Articles of the Company under Alberta legislation, which among other things implemented By-law No. 1 as the general by-law of the Company. Further details can be found in the management information circular for the Company's shareholder meeting held on January 13, 2015, which is filed under the Company's profile at www.sedar.com.

The head office, principal address and registered and records office of the Company are located at 151 Bloor Street West, Suite 703, Toronto, Ontario, Canada, M5S 1S4.

Since inception, the Company has incurred losses amounting to \$10,714,429. During the year, the Company reported a net comprehensive loss of \$1,460,467 (2017 – \$1,755,220). As at January 31, 2018, the Company had working capital of \$1,084,867 (2017 working capital deficit – \$1,461,821). The ability of the Company to continue as a going concern is dependent upon generating profitable operations from its acquisition and change of business, the continuing financial support of shareholders or other investors, or obtaining new financing on commercial terms acceptable to the Company. All of these outcomes are uncertain and cast significant doubt

over the ability of the Company to continue as a going concern.

Market Trends

Internet of Things Inc. believes that the global market trends in Internet of Things adoption are strong and will continue to grow at a rapid pace as the potential to streamline and deliver greater time and cost savings to a broad spectrum of enterprise tasks is proliferating.

Cisco predicts the global Internet of Things market will be \$14.4 Trillion by 2022, including reducing the time-to-market (\$3T), improving supply chain and logistics (\$2.7T), cost reduction strategies (\$2.5T) and increasing employee productivity (\$2.5T). Cisco also found that 50% of IoT activity today is in manufacturing, transformation, smart cities and consumer markets.

ABI Research forecasts that IoT-related value-added services will grow from \$50B in 2012 to \$120B in 2018, attaining a 15.71% CAGR in the forecast period, while the worldwide revenue opportunity for IoT in manufacturing will grow from \$472B in 2014 to \$913B in 2018, attaining a 17.93% CAGR. Growth has been very rapid in these market segments, and represents particularly strong opportunities for the Company moving forward.

According to a December 2013, survey by the American Society for Quality, only 13 per cent of the manufacturers surveyed claimed to have implemented smart manufacturing within their organization. Of those organizations, 82 per cent said they have experienced increased efficiency.

IoT benefits manufacturers by collecting data from sensors, and communicating those data to factory floor workers, plant managers, software systems and many aspects of the supply chain.

Furthermore, according to BI Intelligence, software and services will be a \$600B market by 2019, attaining a 44% CAGR from 2015 to 2019. The World Economic Forum notes that the number of connected devices is projected to grow from 22.9B in 2016 to 50.1B by 2020, attaining a 21.62% CAGR in four years.

Internet of Things Inc. is uniquely positioned to take advantage of the market opportunity as an IoT technology accelerator and industry acquisition company, focused on accelerating IoT-based technology companies, and the development and implementation of disruptive IoT-based solutions. Although the market outlook remains positive, there can be no assurance that this trend will continue or that the Company will benefit from this trend.

Year Ended January 31, 2018 compared to Year Ended January 31, 2017

The Company experienced a net loss from operations of \$1,304,495 for the twelve months ended January 31, 2018 compared to a net loss of \$1,777,924 for the comparable twelve months ended January 31, 2017.

Acquisition

On April 30, 2015, the Internet of Things Inc. acquired Double Door Communications Inc. (“Double Door”) through the purchase all of the issued and outstanding shares in Double Door. On closing, the Company issued 10,000,000 shares of Internet of Things Inc. In addition, the Company committed to issue a maximum of 5,000,000 additional shares based on achievement of certain revenue targets.

Recent Developments***Weather Telematics Inc.***

On November 8, 2017, the Company and Weather Telematics Inc. (“WTX Inc.”), a leader in offering AI-based real-time and predictive road weather conditions and dynamic routing solutions, are pleased to announce that they have signed a global distribution agreement.

On June 15, 2017, the Company signed a Letter of Intent to acquire Weather Telematics Inc. in a \$3.0 million cash, stock, and assumption of debt transaction. Over the course of the past few months, both parties decided not to complete the acquisition, but rather to pursue a global distribution partnership. Under this distribution agreement, the Company will not be paying any cash consideration, not issuing any stock nor assuming any debt.

Subsequent to the year end, on May 14, 2018, the Company entered into a letter agreement to acquire Weather Telematics Inc, a data science company offering real-time advanced artificial intelligence based predictive road condition weather analytics for safer, connected and autonomous transportation.

The Company intends to acquire 100% of the issued and outstanding shares of WTX Inc. for 2.53 million, \$230,000 in cash payable at closing, \$300,000 in cash payable on the 6-month anniversary post closing and \$2,000,000 in IoT Inc. treasury shares priced on a 5-day VWAP over the next five days, with 50% of the shares to be released over three years on the 12th month, 24th month and 36th month anniversaries post closing and the 50% balance to be released on achieving \$8.2 million minimum net sales target over 36 months with pro rata releases every six months.

New Hope Joint Venture

On March 15, 2017, the Company signed a Letter of Intent to form a joint venture partnership with New Hope Data Technology Co., Ltd. a New Hope Group affiliated and invested company.

New Hope is one of China’s largest privately-owned enterprises and in the Top 500 Enterprises for 14 consecutive years. With more than 600 subsidiaries and nearly 70,000 employees and annual revenues of nearly 80 Billion Yuan or \$15.5 Billion, It is involved in a wide range of sectors, from agriculture and real estate to infrastructure, chemical engineering, finance and insurance.

Over the last few years, Chinese industries have gone through a massive transition from reliance on low cost labour to implementing manufacturing efficiencies through advanced technologies. IoT technology will likely help China's industrial sector grow significantly over the coming years, producing an estimated cumulative growth for China's GDP of US\$1.8 trillion by 2030, according to a recent Accenture report.

The partnership will position Internet of Things Inc. to sell Internet of Things ("IoT") solutions and services to New Hope's network of factories and businesses, in addition to other customers across mainland China. New Hope aims to use Industrial IoT technologies to improve the operational efficiency and transparency of New Hope owned factories as well as other manufacturing facilities in China.

ITT Inc. especially sees substantial market demand for solutions assisting with factory automation and plant floor control systems, security and surveillance, process control, inventory management, employee safety and related areas. It aims to reach its goals partly through distribution and sales partnerships. As well, the Company is relying on technology initiatives with companies, universities and research institutes in the US, Canada and Israel. These partners will develop solutions that are in high demand in China.

Chinese industries are rapidly modernizing to remain competitive globally. Broad adoption of IoT technologies to improve industrial efficiency could produce cumulative growth for China's GDP of US\$1.8 Trillion by 2030, analysts from Accenture recently reported.

New Hope will hold a 49% interest in the new joint venture and will invest initially \$2 Million as an operating and working capital loan while IoT Inc. will hold a 51% interest. Initially, upon signing the definitive joint venture agreements, New Hope will also invest \$300,000 by way of a convertible debenture into IoT Inc. for general corporate purposes.

IoT Inc. expects revenues of the JV over the three-year term to be in the \$20 to \$30 million range. This revenue expectation for the JV is based upon estimates which have been provided to the Company by New Hope as a significant amount of the projected revenue is expected to be generated by New Hope, its affiliated companies and its customers. This revenue expectation is what would generate the \$3.5 million in aggregate net income over the first three years, which would result in New Hope being issued 28 million common shares of the Company that are milestone based. This recurring annual revenue model in partnership with the New Hope network of factories and businesses is expected to provide IoT Inc. with ongoing revenue and a profitable income stream.

In addition, the joint venture plans to negotiate strategic distribution partnerships with various leading IoT technology companies around the world. The joint venture will source their partners' solutions and deploy their technologies into New Hope's network of companies as well as other companies across China. The joint venture will also plan to negotiate options to purchase equity in some of the solution providers from which it secures distribution rights.

IoT Inc. announced its new strategy to focus on developing partnerships to allow for market penetration in China in early February. There is significant market demand for IoT solutions in a wide range of areas, from factory automation and plant floor control systems to security and

surveillance, process control, inventory management, employee safety and more.

On May 30, 2017, the Company signed joint venture agreement based on the Letter of Intent announced on March 15, 2017.

Under the terms of the JV, ITT Inc. will hold a 51% interest and will be responsible for providing global industrial IoT technologies such as sensors, predictive analytics and secured wireless, among other technologies to New Hope's network of more than 600 factories and businesses, in addition to other customers across mainland China. New Hope will hold a 49% interest in the JV and its sales and marketing team, big data platform and IT consultants will be responsible for the JV day-to-day operations. New Hope will also invest initially \$2 Million as an operating and working capital loan into the JV.

As consideration for New Hope entering into the 30-year joint venture partnership and for providing resources, personnel, finance and all other support for the start of the JV, ITT Inc. will issue 28 million common shares to New Hope. These shares will be subject to performance milestones based upon: (i) the JV generating \$3.5 million in aggregate net income over the first three years; (ii) annual releases from escrow as net income is achieved on a pro-rata basis; (iii) a 12-month leak-out in 12 equal monthly installments for each annual release of shares; and (iv) regulatory resale restrictions and TSX Venture Exchange approval.

On August 1, 2017, Internet of Things Inc. and New Hope Data Technology Co., Ltd appointed Michael Agam as CEO of New Hope-IoT Intl. Inc. The Company has started trials with several leading North American, European and Israeli Internet of Things (IoT) hardware/software, communications and cybersecurity companies. Management anticipates that these initiatives will start generating revenue in Q1 2018.

Over the past quarter, New Hope IoT Intl Inc. JV has made progress with the following undertakings:

1. The JV signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Gemsens, a leading Industrial IoT hardware solution provider based in Israel. Under the MoU, Gemsens will develop a new product for asset management (addressing applications such as warehouse management, medical equipment location, etc.). The new product will allow for extremely accurate indoor positioning at an affordable price.
2. The JV is preparing to conduct a Proof of Concept (PoC) with Augury, an Internet of Things technology start-up based in the United States and Israel, which has developed a predictive-maintenance solution that several dozen U.S. companies are currently using to collect sensor data about machines via Bluetooth Low Energy (BLE) technology. The company expects to start the PoC at the beginning of November 2017.
3. The JV is undergoing a PoC with GateTell/Telit products. Since 2002, GateTell (California) has been providing intelligent Cellular Devices (also referred to as - Terminals, Modems, and Gateways), that can automatically 'make decisions' at the edge, hence optimizing the amount of data sent to a server or a Cloud and therefore minimizing the cost of data being transferred through the network.

Telit is the global leader in Internet of Things enablement. They offer the industry's broadest portfolio of integrated products, platforms and services to support and enable IoT deployments from things to apps.

4. Working with local as well as with international supply chain management providers to put together a comprehensive supply chain management solution based on new IoT products.

In addition, the JV will be broadening its scope to become an investment centre for Industrial IoT solutions. The JV is currently working with its stakeholders to define the criteria, mandates and funding for this investment strategy.

The JV continues to expand the development of its offerings, relationships with technology providers and its application for the China market. For the year ended January 31, 2018, there are no liabilities associated with New Hope IoT Intl. Inc. joint venture.

BrainGrid Joint Venture

On December 15, 2015, the Company and BrainGrid Corporation ("BrainGrid") a designer, manufacturer, and marketer of advanced digital communication devices and software systems that enable the Internet of Things, have entered into a joint venture agreement. The joint venture company, BrainGrid Solutions Ltd. ("BrainGrid Solutions" or the "JV Company") will market, sell and distribute BrainGrid's flagship product, the 'Sentroller' and related BrainGrid IoT technology applications. The BrainGrid JV enhances the technology and platform acquired through the Double Door acquisition and allows the Company to focus exclusively on the IoT marketplace.

Internet of Things Inc. acquired a minority equity position in BrainGrid for \$500,000 as an initial investment with an option to increase its interest over the next 6 months. The Company issued 15.5 million warrants to BrainGrid as it directs, with each warrant exercisable into a common share at an exercise price of \$0.05 per share of Internet of Things Inc. for a period of 60 months. Any common shares issued pursuant to the exercise of the warrants shall be subject to resale restrictions during the first 24 months, with 5% of the shares being available for resale on a monthly basis following expiration of the four month hold period.

In addition, the Company issued 900,000 warrants to an arm's length party as a finder's fee, each warrant exercisable into a common share at an exercise price of \$0.05 per share for a period of 60 months. Any shares issued pursuant to the exercise of these warrants will be subject to the same resale restrictions as govern the warrants issued to BrainGrid.

For the year ended January 31, 2018, there has been no activity within the joint venture. In September 2017, the company signed joint venture termination agreement and recalled 6 million warrants from BrainGrid. These warrants are held in trust until being reassigned.

Liquidity and Capital Resources

As of January 31, 2018, the Company had a working capital of \$1,084,867 as compared to a working capital deficiency of \$1,461,821 in 2017.

For the Year Ended January 31, 2018

The Company plans on raising additional working capital through an equity private placement financing or a convertible debt financing, as the capital markets permit, in an effort to finance its growth plans and expansion into new international markets. The Company has been successful in raising sufficient working capital in the past.

Since inception, the Company has incurred losses amounting to \$10,714,429. During the year, the Company reported a net loss and comprehensive loss of \$1,460,467 (2017 – net loss of \$1,755,220). The ability of the Company to continue as a going concern is dependent upon generating profitable operations from its current acquisition and change of business, the continuing financial support of shareholders or other investors, or obtaining new financing on commercial terms acceptable to the Company. All of these outcomes are uncertain and cast significant doubt over the ability of the Company to continue as a going concern.

Intangibles

On April 30, 2015, the Company acquired all of the issued and outstanding common shares of Double Door. The fair value of Double Door’s software technology was valued at \$393,338 on the date of the acquisition. The software is being amortized on a straight line basis over 5 years. \$58,864 of amortization was incurred in 2018.

Convertible Debenture Financings

On April 30, 2015, the Company completed a Convertible Debenture, Series A, financing for gross proceeds of \$525,000. The financing is comprised of the issuance of convertible debentures which have a maturity date of two years from the date of issuance and pay interest at the rate of 12% per year, calculated and payable quarterly in arrears. All amounts owing under the convertible debentures are secured by a fixed and floating charge against the assets of Internet of Things Inc. The debentures are convertible to units comprised of one common share and one common share purchase warrant. Each warrant is convertible into a common share at an exercise price of \$0.075. The conversion price is \$0.05 per unit for the first 12 months and \$0.10 until maturity. At the time of issuance, the equity portion of this convertible debt issuance was valued at \$76,577.

For the Year Ended January 31, 2018

These debentures were fully converted before April 30, 2017. As the result, 4,450,000 common shares and 4,450,000 warrants were issued.

On January 5, 2016, the Company completed a Convertible Debenture, Series B and Series C, financing for gross proceeds of \$551,000. The financing is similarly comprised of the issuance of convertible debentures which have a maturity date of two years from the date of issuance and pay interest at the rate of 12% per year, calculated and payable quarterly in arrears. All amounts owing under the Convertible Debentures are secured by a fixed and floating charge against the assets of the Company. For Series B of the issuance of the debentures, the conversion price is \$0.05 per unit for the first 12 months and \$0.10 until maturity. For Series C of the issuance, the conversion price is \$0.10 per unit until maturity. The debentures are convertible to units comprised of one common share and one common share purchase warrant. Each warrant is convertible into a common share at an exercise price of \$0.125. At the time of issuance, the equity portion of this convertible debt issuance was valued at \$124,197.

Above debenture were fully converted before January 5, 2018. As the result, 5,551,000 common shares and 3,010,000 warrants were issued.

The Company has incurred accretion expense of \$77,624 and interest expense of \$44,108 for the year ended January 31, 2018 relating to the two debenture issuances.

Share Capital

In March 2017, \$10,000 of the Convertible Debenture, Series A was converted to 100,000 common shares and 100,000 warrants. \$150,000 of the Convertible Debenture, Series B was converted to 1,500,000 common shares. \$10,000 of the Convertible Debenture, Series C was converted to 100,000 common shares and 100,000 warrants.

In April 2017, \$301,000 of convertible debentures were converted into 3,010,000 common shares and 3,010,000 warrants were issued.

In May 2017, \$144,000 of convertible debentures were converted into 1,440,000 common shares and 1,440,000 warrants were issued.

In June 2017, \$100,000 of convertible debenture was converted to 1,000,000 common shares.

In January 2018, \$281,000 of convertible debentures were converted into 2,810,000 common shares and 2,810,000 warrants were issued.

During the year, 2,000,000 warrants were exercised to common shares for \$150,000; 2,880,000 stock options were exercised for \$144,000.

On January 29, 2018, the Company closed the non-brokered private placement of 23,000,000 equity units of the Company at a price of \$0.10 per equity unit for gross proceeds of \$2,300,000. Each equity unit is comprised of one common share of the Company and one-half of one common share purchase warrant. Each whole Warrant entitles the holder to acquire one common share of the Company for a period of 24 months from the date of issuance of the Warrant and the exercise

price is \$0.18 per share.

Related Party Balances and Transactions

During the year, the Company had the following transactions with related parties, mad in the normal course of operations, and accounted for at an amount of consideration established and agreed to by the Company and related parties.

The Company incurred management fees to related parties in the amount of \$108,000 (2017 - \$108,000) and consulting fees to related parties in the amount of \$83,333 (2017 - \$nil). As at January 31, 2018, \$90,000 was payable to the CEO (2017 - \$60,000), \$64,000 was payable to the CFO (2017 - \$48,000) and \$94,167 was payable to one director.

The Company was charged \$53,642 (2017 - \$14,744) to a corporation with director and officer in common for rent, administration, office charges and telecommunications.

Business Risk and Uncertainties

We are subject to a number of risks and uncertainties that can significantly affect our business, financial condition and future financial performance as described below. In particular, there remain significant uncertainties in capital markets impacting the availability of equity financing. While these uncertainties in capital markets do not have a direct impact on our ability to carry out our business, the Company may be impacted should it become more difficult to gain access to capital when and if needed. These risks and uncertainties are not necessarily the only risks the Company faces. Additional risks and uncertainties that are presently unknown to the Company may adversely affect our business.

Limited Operating History

Internet of Things Inc. has a limited operating history and has no material revenues derived from operations. ITT Inc. may not be able to achieve profitability or continue operations on an ongoing basis. As well, the Company has encountered and will continue to encounter risks and difficulties frequently experienced by growing companies in rapidly changing industries, including challenges in accurate financial planning and forecasting.

Problems Resulting from Rapid Growth

Internet of Things Inc. will be pursuing a plan to market its platform throughout Canada, the United States and abroad, and will require capital in order to meet these growth plans. There can be no assurances that proceeds from the ITT Inc. Financing will enable the Company to meet these growth needs. Internet of Things Inc. expects to require significant working capital and other financial resources to implement its plan for rapid growth, including attracting and retaining qualified personnel. No assurance exists that the plan will be successful and this may have a material adverse consequence on the business of ITT Inc.

Growth of E-Commerce

The business of selling goods and services over the Internet is dynamic and relatively new. Concerns about fraud, privacy and other challenges may discourage consumers and customers from adopting the Internet as a medium of commerce.

Liquidity and Capital Requirements

Internet of Things Inc. faces significant challenges in order to achieve profitability. There can be no assurance that it will be able to maintain adequate liquidity or achieve long-term viability. ITT Inc.'s ability to meet its obligations in the ordinary course of business is dependent upon management's ability to establish profitable operations or raise capital, as needed, through public, or private debt or equity financing, or other sources of financing to fund operations.

The disruption of the capital markets and/or a decline in economic conditions, amongst other factors, could negatively impact the Company's ability to achieve profitability or raise additional capital when needed. In order to optimize the growth of the business, ITT Inc. may need to seek to raise additional debt or equity financing. There can be no assurance that the Company will be able to identify a source of such financing, or that such financing will be available on acceptable terms, if at all. Moreover, should the opportunity to raise additional capital arise, any additional debt or equity financing could result in significant dilution of the existing holders of ITT Inc. Shares.

Acquisitions or Other Business Transactions

Internet of Things Inc. may, when and if opportunities arise, acquire other products, technologies or businesses that are complementary to its business. Acquisitions involve numerous risks, including difficulties in the assimilation of the operations, technologies and products of the acquired companies, the diversion of management's attention from other business concerns, risks associated with entering new markets or conducting operations in industry segments in which ITT

Inc. has no or limited experience, and the potential loss of key employees of the acquired company. Moreover, there can be no assurances that any anticipated benefits of an acquisition will be realized. Future acquisitions by the Company. could result in potentially dilutive issuances of equity securities, the use of cash, the incurrence of debt and contingent liabilities, and write-off of acquired research and development costs, all of which could materially adversely affect ITT Inc.'s financial condition, results of operations and cashflows.

Retention or Maintenance of Key Personnel

Although Internet of Things Inc Inc.'s management has made efforts to align the interests of key employees with ITT Inc. by, among other things, granting equity interests in ITT Inc. to its operations personnel with vesting schedules tied to continued employment, there is no assurance that the Company can attract or retain key personnel in a timely manner as the need arises. Failure to have adequate personnel may materially compromise the ability of ITT Inc. to operate its business.

Conflicts of Interest

Internet of Things Inc. may contract with affiliated parties, members of management of ITT Inc., or companies owned or controlled by members of ITT Inc.'s management. These parties or persons may obtain compensation and other benefits in transactions relating to ITT Inc.

Certain members of management of the Company. have other business activities in addition to the business of ITT Inc., although each such member of management is contracted to devote the

substantial majority of his or her working time to the Company. Despite management's intention to act fairly, it is possible that the Company could inadvertently enter into arrangements with related parties that feature less favourable terms than could have been obtained from unrelated parties.

Proprietary Rights Could Be Subject to Suits or Claims

No assurance exists that Internet of Things Inc. or any company with which it conducts business can or will be successful in pursuing protection of the Company's proprietary rights such as business names, logos, marks, ideas, inventions, copyrights in photos and other visual works, and technology. In many cases, governmental registrations may not be available or advisable, considering legalities and expense, and even if registrations are obtained, adverse claims or litigation could occur.
