



gan's capital city. With over 60 festivals and events throughout the year, it's no wonder Lansing is known as Michigan's festival capital and provides the perfect reason to visit. This Spring find *Mighty Uke Day 9*, the largest ukulele festival in the Midwest, the East Lansing Art Festival and adjacent MSU Arts and Crafts Show, Margarita Festival and Beerfest at the Ballpark. Speaking of ballparks, Spring ushers in some minor league baseball (the Lansing Lugnuts are a Toronto Blue Jays affiliate) or even some professional soccer with the newly-formed Lansing Ignite, Michigan's only professional soccer team.

While in town, take advantage of Lansing's walkable downtown and visit five awesome attractions within a five block radius. Take a tour of the State Capitol Building, the Michigan History Center, the R.E. Olds Transportation Museum and discover the fun side of science at Impression 5 Science Center. Binder Park Zoo

Binder Park Zoo in southwest Michigan is unlike any other zoo experience! Set on 433 spectacular acres, the zoo is home to more than 500 exotic and native animal species. Thoughtful exhibit design blends spacious animal habitats into the surrounding landscape — a 40 year hallmark of the zoo that inspires awe and commands respect for these amazing creatures.

In the East Zoo, paths wind around spaces where kangaroos bound, a snow leopard prowls and black bears wrestle. Drop into the *Adventure Station* to peek in on the sloths, amphibians and reptiles. Hear the whistle blow as you board the Z.O. & O. vintage train at the station to ride the rails past animal exhibits and into the beyond.

At the International Depot, board the zebra-striped Wilderness Tram to Wild Africa and Zuri National Park. Elevated boardwalks zigzag under a canopy of tall trees leading you to the savanna's edge where herds of addax, bontebok and waterbuck roam with marabou storks, ostriches and giraffes. A visit to Twiga Overlook is de rigueur for guests to come face to face with the giraffes and feed them snacks of lettuce — a singularly memorable experience! Continue past the cheetahs towards the newest exhibits at the zoo — African painted dogs; where a pack of eleven young pups romp and their neighbors the majestic African lions lounge. Both exhibits feature multiple viewings including glass walls allowing you to be as close up to these magnificent creatures as you'll ever be!

A 600 lb. Aldabra giant tortoise, Monkey Valley, exotic birds, Red River hogs and domestic African farm animals still lie ahead on your route before completing the loop back to the tram station.

A full schedule of Education Programs including group and family overnights in an authentic African tented camp—the only one in the Midwest—teach the importance of conservation through creative and fun experiences and an exciting roster of unique fund-raising events (like the Cheetah Chase 5K, Corks for Conservation wine festival and others) engage zoo-lovers and party-goers alike.







Other local dining options feature fresh-caught whitefish, farm-to-table trends, and even a selection of locally roasted coffees or handcrafted cocktails.


While hibernating through winter doesn't happen in Marquette County, when spring is in the air, new opportunities for activities and adventures abound. Some highlights include:

- Experience amazing vistas from the peaks of Sugarloaf, Hogback and Top-of-the-World mountains. Park and go from well-marked trailheads.

A variety of events fill the calendar with fun activities, great food and treasured memories. The Angry Bear Festival at the Ore Dock Brewery is a celebration of the thaw that takes over aptly named Spring Street on April 13, the new Way Up Music Festival is May 24-25, the family-friendly Marquette Trails Festival is the weekend of June 21-23 and Art Week kicks off on June 24, along with the Downtown Farmer's Market each Saturday at the Marquette Commons.

Strolling the streets of downtown Marquette, one can easily sense the rich history of this community built primarily on the development of the mining industry, with architectural reminders from subtle train truss benches to the enormous Ore Dock, along with the centurion businesses that are still operating.

Meandering Around Monroe County

ocated on the Western shores of Lake Eire between Metro Detroit and Toledo, Monroe County Michigan is fast becoming a destination for travelers. Lured by its rural landscape and historic small town appeal, the county offers easy access to all of the near by attractions via two major highways.

One of the oldest counties in Michigan, Monroe Co. played a significant role of the War of 1812 conflict. The *River Raisin Battlefield* was the site of one of America's

bloodiest defeats by Tecumseh's American Indian Confederation, and British and Canadian forces. The Site is one of four National Battlefields in America and is located in Monroe, Michigan. The *River Raisin Heritage Trail* connects the River Raisin Battlefield National Park to sprawling Sterling State Park. Visitors are drawn to the park's mile-long Lake Erie beach and back waterways filled with Lotus flowers in the late summer. The county is considered the *Lotus Capital of Michigan*.

The Huron River marks the northern border of the county and is a favorite for canoeing and kayaking. The river flows into lake Erie and passes through part of the *Detroit River International Wildlife Refuge* and *Pointe Mouille State Game Area*.


The city of Monroe's downtown exhibits a great example of mid-19th century to early 20th century architecture. Shopping, restaurants and cafes are easily walkable and parking is free. The Monroe County Historical Museum features an extensive collection of artifacts from General George A. Custer, who made Monroe his home. The River Raisin Jazz Festival takes place the 2nd weekend of August and has featured world class artists such as Kenny G and Chuck Mangione.

The Village of Dundee features

great eats, shopping and the *Old Mill Museum*, which offers ghost hunts and paranormal investigations. Dundee is also home to Michigan's first *Cabela's World Foremost Outdoor* store. The gigantic 225,000-sq.-ft. showroom is packed with outdoor equipment and experienced Outfitters who are ready to help you get the most out of your next adventure. It also has the world's largest wildlife bronze sculpture just outside it's front door.

Luna Pier has one of the hideouts for notorious depression era criminal Pretty Boy Floyd. It's beautiful beach, lighthouse and wonderful dining make it a great place for summer relaxing. It is a short distance from there to Lambertville for a camel ride at the Indian Creek Zoo.



ecently named "The Prettiest Town in Michigan" by Architectural Digest, Holland is a Pure Michigan delight! Join us this spring as we "paint the town orange" (with tulips) in celebration of the 90th Anniversary of the Tulip Time Festival May 4 – 12, 2019.

Millions of tulips line the streets, burst forth in Holland Michigan's city parks and growing fields, and surround our beloved 260 year-old working windmill, DeZwaan, the only original Dutch windmill in the US. Three parades, hundreds of costumed "klompen" dancers wearing wooden shoes, and headline entertainment round out the fun.

If you can't make it for the festival, there is still plenty of springtime fun! Dutch attractions like Windmill Island Gardens, Veldheer Gardens & DeKlomp Wooden Shoe & Delft Factory, and Nelis' Dutch Village, are all open until early fall.

The award-winning downtown, features cobblestone sidewalks, Victorian streetlights, bronze statues, and over 100 independently-owned shops, galleries, eateries and brew pubs comes live on Thursday evenings with street performers of all genres – musicians, magicians, mimes and aerial acrobats beginning in June.

Holland's downtown-area Farmer's Market boasts over 90 vendors on Wednesdays and Saturdays and features locally-sourced produce, flowers, meats, cheeses and breads.

If hiking is more your style, head to Mt Pisgah, a towering sand dune overlooking Lake Michigan, Lake Macatawa, and the famous "Big Red" Lighthouse. Climb the 237 steps to the top; on a clear day you

can see 14 miles across Lake Michigan's blue waters. As the crow flies, Holland is 90 miles from Milwaukee, so you won't see the other side! Or hike the beautiful wooded dunes at Sanctuary Woods.

Biking your thing? The greater Holland area has over 150 miles of paved bike paths, including a 20-mile ride between Holland State Park and Grand Haven State Park, our neighbor to the north. If you don't want to bring your bike, you can rent regular or electric bikes after you arrive.

Be sure to stop by the Holland Area Visitors Bureau (open 7 days a week) in downtown Holland for your Handcrafted Passport, featuring breweries, distilleries, wineries and cideries in the greater Holland area. Fill your passport with stamps from participating establishments and you'll receive a locally-made handcrafted bar blade.

For family fun, be sure to stop at BAM!, voted the Best Family Entertainment Center in West Michigan. Featuring two-story laser tag, monster bowling, escape rooms, arcade, and a high ropes course for the kids, plus a restaurant and brew pub for adults, there truly is something for everyone. Holland is also home to a world-class Aquatic Center with an Olympic-size pool, 150-foot water slide, a water playground with water cannons, and a spa for relaxing. 





Things to see & do in the Garden State

pring is eco-tourism season in New Jersey's Meadowlands. Birders and nature lovers can spot some of the more than 285 species that have been identified across the 8,400 acres of wetlands and riverbanks in 14 Bergen and Hudson County towns. Take a pontoon boat ride along the Hackensack River, while spotting a sharp shinned hawk and herons in the marsh. Even the mighty Bald Eagle can be spotted nesting along the way. Millions of birds will be migrating through the Meadowlands on the Atlantic Flyway this spring. 






















Surf's up at Panama City Beach

anama City Florida has been called "the best beach this side of paradise." Home to 27 miles of pristine beach the talcum-like sand is attributed to quartz crystals washing down from the Appalachian Mountains centuries ago. Along the way, the crystals were bleached, ground, smoothed and polished. The surf and tides of the Gulf of Mexico are responsible for depositing millions of grains of sugar-white sand on the shore.

This laid back slice of Florida's Gulf Coast is actually closer in distance and demeanor to Dixie, than to its flashy Florida siblings. Visitors will find more than 16,500 rooms, ranging from resorts, hotels, town homes, condos and villas, many at affordable rates.

St. Andrew's State Recreation Area is famous for its jade green waters and the park's 1,260-acres of sand dunes are fringed by woodlands on one side and the ocean on the other. It's a perennial

pick as one of Florida's Best Beaches by Dr. Stephen P. Leatherman, better known as Dr. Beach.

Here you'll find Florida at its most natural, complete with graceful sand dunes, coastal scrub forest, pine hammocks, and an inland lake.

Visitors can take a shuttle over to nearby *Shell Island*. This 700-acre wildlife sanctuary is home to a number of wild bird species, including pelicans, sandpipers, and snowy plovers. Dazzling tropical fish, sea turtles and other aquatic life also call the area around Shell Island home. Legend has it that pirates once buried their booty on the island's *Spanish Shanty Point*. The abundant sea is one of the most densely populated bottle-nosed dolphins habitats in the world.

Divers can explore historic wrecks, including a 441-foot World War II ship, a coastal freighter, several tugboats and the Gulf of Mexico's most famous wreck, the 465-foot *Empire Mica*.

For panoramic views, take a ride on *Panhandle Helicopters*. Their popular Miracle Strip tour takes you along the beach, allowing you to see both city and county piers, over the Shipwreck Waterpark and all of the hotels and beach life in between. Dolphins, stingrays and sea turtles are common viewing on this tour so be sure to bring your video camera!

Explore multiple attractions, odd



exhibits, and hands-on interactives at *Ripley's Panama City Beach*. The *Odditorium* is filled with shrunken heads, car-part sculptures, and an authentic vampire killing kit. Other attractions include the 7D Moving Theater, Impossible Laser and the Mirror Maze.

Away from the beach visitors will find unique family attractions. *Pier Park* is located in the heart of town across from City Pier. The largest shopping/dining/ entertainment venue in Northwest Florida, it features a colorful mix of popular national chains and favorite local boutiques and eateries and something completely different — a collection of vintage rides from the now closed *Miracle Strip Amusement Park*. The recently launched *Décor By The Shore Trail*, boasts a vast selection of stores and shops specializing in coastal-themed antiques, furniture, gifts and accessories.

Known as the "Seafood Capital of the South," Panama City Beach offers diners dozens of choices. Stop in for breakfast at *Andy's Flour Power Bakery and Cafe* for the best breakfasts in town. Choose from fluffy rolled omelets cooked to perfection, Belgian waffles, cheese grits, biscuits and gravy, a veggie frittata and eggs, any way you want them. Come back for lunch for

Try one of their signature cocktails like a Blue Marlin Martini, or a Ginger Rum Cooler, while sitting back and enjoying the serenity of the lagoon.

Accommodations include *Palazzo Condominiums*, located on the west end of Panama City's dazzling white-sand beaches. The *Hombre Golf Club*, offers three championship nines named the "The Good, The Bad & The Ugly," with water on 21 of the 27 holes.

Wapakoneta parties like it's 1969

Celebrate Apollo 11 in Neil Armstrong's hometown

n July 20, 1969, the world paused for a brief, shining moment. Apollo 11 had reached the moon. Neil Alden Armstrong, stepped out of the lunar module Eagle and set foot on the soft dust of the lunar surface and said the words we still quote today: "That's one small step for man, one giant leap for mankind."

This year marks the 50th Anniversary of those first steps onto the moon. This incredible event was celebrated not only in the United States, but around the world. The anniversary holds special meaning for the residents of Wapakoneta, Ohio because the man who took those steps called this community home.

An entire year of events and festivities has been planned in Wapakoneta and Auglaize County, Ohio to honor Neil Armstrong, Buzz Aldrin, and Michael Collins, and also the tens of thousands of men and women whose efforts made Apollo 11 successful. They've been celebrating the first steps on the moon for 49 years, and they'd love to have you join them in 2019 for the 50th anniversary celebration.

Throughout the spring and early summer there will be monthly stargazing events, special guest speakers and musical concerts. When you visit Wapakoneta check out their lovely, historic downtown. It's brimming with unique shops and a wide variety of places to eat, grab a snack or a drink. It's a great place to stroll and enjoy the same friendly community that Neil Armstrong experienced as a boy. But the must-see attraction is, of course, the Armstrong Air & Space Museum. Opened only three years after the moon landing, on July 20, 1972, the museum takes visitors on a journey through aerospace history. There you can explore Armstrong's story and other Ohioan's achievements in the history of flight. The museum itself is designed to resemble a futuristic moon base and contains many authentic artifacts, including the Gemini VIII spacecraft, Neil Armstrong's Gemini and Apollo spacesuits, and a lunar sample — the NASA term for a moon rock. The museum is also home to two full-size aircraft, including the Aeronca Champion, the very airplane in which Neil Armstrong learned to fly.

Enjoy interactive exhibits and simulators. Visitors can practice landing the lunar module and space shuttle, experience simulated zero gravity or dock the Gemini capsule, just as Armstrong did in 1966. The 56-foot dome in the center of the museum houses the *Astro Theater*, where guests can watch an informative movie. Simulators and the film are included with your admission to the Armstrong Air & Space Museum.

So get ready to party like its 1969 and make plans to visit. Wapakoneta is easy to find, on I-75 at exit 111.


