



# It's all Happening in New Jersey The Garden State is having a moment

ewark should be your next summer weekend retreat. Now in the middle of a renaissance, high rise buildings are popping up like dandelions, as well as the renovation of historic structures in the downtown area.

Friends and family gather to bike along tranquil stretches of the Passaic River. Just 8 miles from the Big Apple hotels are a mere fraction of the price of Manhattan.

Take a walk through *Branch Brook Park*, which happens to be home to the nation's largest collection of cherry trees. The oldest county park in the United State has more than 360 acres to explore including expansive lawns, playing fields, winding paths, lakes and pools.

After years of planning, Newark's *Mulberry Commons Park* opened in May. Mulberry Commons will include terraces, an interactive fountain, public art and quiet seating areas. There will also be a beer garden, an event plaza, play spaces and a slide. Newark is also home to numerous art galleries including Aljira, a Center for Contemporary Art City Without Walls, Sumei Arts Center and the Paul Robeson Galleries at Rutgers–Newark.

Newark Liberty International Airport sees approximately 15 million international travelers pass through its gates every year. The Greater Newark Convention and Visitors Bureau recently unveiled an historical display at the center of Terminal B, which handles international travel, hoping to encourage tourism in city. Newark is home to the Budweiser brewery, the birthplace of Whitney Houston and Shaquille O'Neal, Thomas Edison's first workshop; the old Tiffany & Co. factory and the Prudential and Red Bull sports arenas. The showcase of Newark's his-

tory and culture is accompanied by six billboards, which are spread out in every terminal, marketing the city as a travel destination. Terminal B is also getting new 'Jersey Shore' food court featuring Smashburgers and Budweiser beer. Dubbed "Jersey by the Shore" the food court will include Malone's Fish Market, Firehouse Subs and Little Tony's Pizzeria.

TV buffs will be happy to learn that Newark's own Anthony "Tony Boy" Boiardo, was the real life inspiration for Tony Soprano and many of the Soprano's episodes were filmed here. One of Newark's largest annual celebrations is its *Brazilian Independence Day Festival* held over Labor Day weekend. Sculptor Gutzon Borglum, who also created Mount Rushmore, sculpted the *Wars of America* monument in Newark's Military Park.

Riverfront Square is a new development that will turn a very urban, concrete area into a nature-filled leisure and cultural retreat for residents and area workers. Located steps away from the Passaic River it will feature up to 2.3 million square feet of office, residential, hospitality, cultural space and more within the city's burgeoning tech sector. The core of the development will be a mass timber building, touted as the tallest of its kind in the United States. The 12-story building will house ground floor retail and restaurants.

#### **The Meadowlands**





# **Surf's Up at Florida's Best Beaches**

ith picture-perfect weather, sugary white sand, and crystal-blue waters, Florida's beaches are the stuff of legends. Here are the Sunshine State's best spots to wiggle your toes in the sand.

Fort De Soto Park at Tierra Verde — Located near St. Petersburg, Fort De Soto Park is a unique area made up of five islands. The park consists of 900 unspoiled acres, seven miles of beaches, and a historic fort built during the Spanish-American War on Mullet Key, the largest of the islands. A nature trail in the Arrowhead Picnic area provides a glimpse of some of the native fauna and flora and canoe, kayak and bicycle rentals are available.

Caladesi Island State Park — Your imagination gets a good workout on Caladesi Island. It's easy to enjoy a Robinson Crusoe-style fantasy about having a tropical island all your own. Walking the three miles of beach, you might see

bottle-nosed dolphins cruising offshore or the tracks of a loggerhead sea turtle. Shorebirds hunt for food on the exposed

sandbars. The park opens daily from 8 a.m. to sunset and a ferry departs hourly from Honeymoon Island.

Crandon Park — Technically one of the first islands in the Florida Keys archipelago, Key Biscayne is a secluded paradise and natural refuge that sits just a few miles east of downtown Miami. Crandon Park, a family-friendly 808-acre urban oasis, is fringed with swaying coconut palms, mangroves, a coastal hammock and sea grass beds. The waves are gentle and visitors can hunt for shells on the beach or relax with a good book under the shade of a Tiki hut. Away from the water, pastimes include a Family Amusement Center and a Nature Center. Nearby Crandon Golf at Key Biscayne is ranked as one of the best public golf courses in America and is home to a resident colony of iguanas.

Lovers Key State Park — Looking for a romantic beach break? Lovers Key is located just south of Estero, on Black Island, a barrier island on the Gulf Coast. The state park offers 2.5 miles of white sand beaches, world-class shelling and the chance to observe nesting loggerhead sea turtles and endangered West Indian manatees. Visitors can rent kayaks or canoes to explore the miles of mangrovelined estuaries, one of the few trees that



thrives in salt water. A turn-of-the-century style beachfront pavilion is available for weddings and special events.

Crescent Beach Siesta Key —Siesta Key is an eight-mile-long barrier island connected to Sarasota by two bridges. Crescent Beach, which extends from the island's northern tip is refreshingly natural, with wild sea oats and mangroves providing a protective habitat for birds and marine life. This broad ribbon of beach slopes gently into lapping waves and has been judged the world's "whitest and most powdery." Made from 99 percent pure quartz, the sand is soft, floury and cool to the touch.

St. Andrew's State Recreation Area — A perennial pick as one of Florida's Best Beaches by Dr. Stephen P. Leatherman, better known as Dr. Beach. Located near Panama City, it's famous for its jade green waters and 1,260-acres of sand dunes fringed by woodlands.

Visitors also can take a shuttle over to nearby Shell Island. This wildlife sanctuary island is actually part of St. Andrews State Park and lies between the Gulf of Mexico and St. Andrews Bay. The 700-acre island is home to a number of wild bird species, including pelicans. The

abundant sea is one of the most densely populated bottle-nosed dolphins habitats in the world.

Home to 27 miles of pristine beach Panama City Florida has been called "the best beach this side of paradise." the talcum-like sand is attributed to quartz crystals washing down from the Appalachian Mountains centuries ago. Along the way, the crystals were bleached, ground, smoothed and polished. The surf and tides of the Gulf of Mexico are responsible for depositing millions of grains of sugar-white sand on the shore.

Here you'll find Florida at its most natural, complete with graceful sand dunes, coastal scrub forest, pine hammocks and an inland lake.

**Destin-Fort Walton Beach** — Unpretentious, uncomplicated and breathtakingly beautiful, Florida's Emerald Coast is simply irresistible. And the gulf near the Florida panhandle really does have a deep, emerald glow.

This carefully preserved string of beach enclaves along Highway 30-A includes Destin, Ft. Walton Beach and Okaloosa Island. Acclaimed as one of America's great coastal beach destinations, miles of dunes, sea oats and pines characterize

the thin peninsula separating the Gulf of Mexico from Choctawhatchee Bay

With 24 miles of heavenly beach like miles of white satin the hardest part was deciding which piece to claim as your own.

Sanibel and Captiva Islands — Sanibel and Captiva are the southernmost islands in a chain of barrier islands stretching along Florida's Gulf Coast. Sanibel and Captiva are part of a chain of barrier islands that stretches along Florida's Gulf Coast. The islands are connected to the mainland by a three-mile-long causeway and to each other by a blink-and-you'll-miss-it bridge at Blind Pass.

Location is also the key to Sanibel's fame as a shell collector's mecca. During the winter, millions of shells are carried onto the beaches by offshore winds and strong underwater currents. Shellers are usually out in force before dawn, scouring the beaches for tiny coquinas, alphabet tulips and the rare junonia.

Both islands boast miles of exquisite beaches and are heavily wooded with pine and tropical vegetation. Brown pelicans dive for their daily ration of fish and dolphins delight in the spectacular sunsets.

rom an award-winning downtown to the white sandy shores of Lake Michigan, Holland is the perfect destination for summer fun! Begin your visit in the "heart" of Holland – downtown. If music along the lakeshore is your

thing, Holland offers free concerts in waterfront Kollen Park every Tuesday and Friday evening and at noon on Wednesday, you can grab a sandwich and enjoy free music in downtown's GDK Park.

Just a short drive from downtown, you can relax and unwind on the "sugar sand" shores of Lake Michigan. Choose from an abundance of things to do—boating, swimming, fishing, stand-up paddle boarding or jet-skiing, or just build a sandcastle and soak up the sun. End your day at the beach by watching the sun sink beneath the horizon in an amazing blaze of glory. While the greater Holland area has a number of waterfront parks and beaches, none is more popular than

Holland State Park, offering the best view of Holland's iconic lighthouse, "Big Red", one of Michigan's most photographed landmarks. For a special treat, be sure to check out nearby Tunnel Park, where you actually walk through a 1930's era concrete tunnel to get to the sparkling waters of Lake Michigan.

For more traditional sightseeing, you can get a taste of Holland's Dutch heritage at Windmill Island Gardens, where "DeZwaan" a 19th century working windmill, imported from the Netherlands over half a century ago, towers over 36 acres of beautifully-manicured lawns and gardens. You can enhance your Dutch experience by also visiting Nelis' Dutch Village, a re-creation of 100 year-old village in the Netherlands, or stopping by DeKlomp Wooden Shoe and Delft Factory, the only production delftware factory in the US.

Home to a number of family-friendly attractions like monster-bowling, laser tag, bumper boats, miniature golf and nature centers, Holland is also a favorite destination for cyclists, with over 150 miles of paved bike paths.

This year Holland Michigan celebrated their 90th anniversary of the annual Tulip Time Festival from May 4-12 and I was surely very fortunate to be part of this traditional street scrubbing during the Volksparade or "People's Parade" with the Governor of Michigan Gretchen Whitmer and the members of media. The whole city was, as if painted with orange tulips, plenty of activities and events took place. I didn't realize pushing the broom could be so much fun!!

In late 2016, Mr. Havens was given the opportunity of a lifetime to create a lasting tribute to those who died in the terrorist attacks on 9/11/2001. He worked with over 7000 lbs. of steel that was recovered from the North World Trade Center. The steel was permanently loaned to the village by the New York Port Authority

for Jim to create a lasting tribute and memorial to the fallen. This sculpture was named the *Public Safety Service Memorial* and was dedicated in 2017.

With such a unique collection of sculptures in one place, the Sandusky County Convention & Visitors Bureau saw an opportunity to create an art and wine festival to celebrate the collection.

The CVB partnered with multiple Ohio wineries, food vendors, entertainers and other area artists to create the *Sculpture* in the Village, Arts & Wine Festival. The event started small two years ago but word quickly spread about this amazing festival and attendance nearly quadrupled in 2018.





## High Times in Switzerland

ith an almost unrivalled record of peace, order and good government it's tempting to characterize the Swiss as a nation of bankers and bureaucrats. In the 1949 classic film "The Third Man" Orson Welles famously declared "Switzerland has had five hundred years of democracy and peace and what did that produce? The cuckoo clock."

Welles of course, was mistaken on a couple of counts. In 2016, Switzerland marked its 725th anniversary as a democratic confederation. And among other things, the Swiss have also given the world yodeling, the Swiss Army Knife and Heidi.

Fans of Johanna Spyri's high-altitude heroine can hike the *Heidi Trail*, sleep on hay in a Heidi hut and accompany a goatherd into the mountains in Heidiland, a region southeast of Zürich, near the border with Liechtenstein.

Switzerland may be a neutral country but it is anything but colorless. Along with the eye-popping scenery Switzerland

is an eminently workable amalgam of German, French and Italian cultures that operates with all the precision of a Swiss watch. There are four national languages including Romansh, a variant of Latin spoken in the mountainous canton of Graubünden.

Zürich is Switzerland's largest city and famous for its gnomes and financial institutions. The Bahnhofstrasse—Zürich's answer to Fifth Avenue and Wall Street—was built on the site of the old city walls and is lined with upscale boutiques, cafes and those ubiquitous Swiss banks.

Bern, the nation's capital, was named after the bears that have been kept in the city since 1480. Visitors to Bern's ancient Bärengraben, or bearpit can purchase food from an official vendor and feed it to the appreciative bruins.

Lausanne in French-speaking western Switzerland, is dotted with vineyards, green pastures and deep forests that overlook Lake Geneva. This city of 125,000 features a medieval core surrounded by a modern, commercial district. The region's Joux Valley is the cradle of Switzerland's watch-making industry and many of the world's most prestigious brands are



made here. Visitors can tour prestigious manufacturers such as Audemars Piguet and Jaeger-LeCoultre.

Geneva's famous Jet d'eau or "water jet" made its debut in 1891, with a plume of 98-feet. Improvements, including the addition of 1,300 hp electric pumps, have increased the jet's height to its present 425-feet, nearly three times higher than the Statue of Liberty.

Lucerne is considered the quintessential Swiss town and its most popular travel destination. Famous for the two medieval bridges spanning the Reuss River, few leave without taking a boat ride on scenic Lake Lucerne, framed by mountains and old growth forests that reach right down to the shore. Visitors can also ride the world's steepest cog railway up Mount Pilatus, which has a gradient of 48 percent, then return via cable car, past soaring peaks, divided by verdant Alpine valleys.

Much of Switzerland's mountainous territory is best seen by rail. The Rhaetion Railway includes the world famous Glacier, and Bernina Express lines. The engineering equivalent of Hannibal's passage through the Alps, it is the only train that crosses over the Alps without

the aid of a cog system. Travelers will pass through scenery that ranges from the blue-tongued glaciers of Piz Bernina, to the palm trees of Tirano, Italy.

St. Moritz is located in the center of the Engadine lake country, almost 2,000 metres up the southern slopes of the Alps. Winter conjures up glamorous images of the Cresta, and horses racing across the snow, but summers here are quite leisurely. You can shop in the world famous boutiques, or visit the healing mineral springs that have drawn visitors for over 3,000 years. St. Moritz has become so synonymous with the jet set that the town has taken the unusual step of registering its name as a trademark in 25 countries.

Ethnomusicologists say yodeling is an ancient form of communication using sudden alterations of vocal register from a low-pitched chest voice to high falsetto tones sung on vowel sounds. In the 4th century A.D. the Roman Emperor Julian complained about the wild shrieking noises coming from the northern mountain people.


The Glacier Express runs from St. Moritz and Davos via Zermatt, where it brings you face to face with the wondrous

Matterhorn or "the mountain," as it is respectfully called by the Swiss. Passengers hang out of windows snapping pictures while the little red train ties itself in knots around seemingly impossible bends. Each new turn brings a magnificent mountain, a stunning gorge or waterfall, or a fantasy-like castle perched on a mountaintop.

Vehicles powered by internal combustion engines have been banned in Zermatt since 1947 and the town's only traffic jam is a herd of Blackneck goats that pass through the Bahnhofstrasse each morning and evening.

Zermatt has over 300 days of sunlight a year and the Swiss call this mild dry weather their "champagne climate". The air is so unbelievably pure that it feels almost as intoxicating as a chilled flute of Pol Roger.

From Zermatt visitors can board the 117-year-old cog railway for the 6.5-mile journey up Gornergrat Mountain. Europe's highest rack railway climbs past Swiss stone pine and larch forests, to a height of 10,100 feet. Once you reach the top take in the breathtaking panorama of 29 peaks all over 13,000 feet, with the Matterhorn, the Queen of the Alps, right in the middle.

Sunrise is sailing a series 4, 6, and 8-night Bermuda cruises from New York, this summer and fall, docking amid the imposing spires of the *Royal Naval Dockyard* (King's Wharf) constructed by convicts between 1809 and 1849. If the stone fortifications and 100-foot towers

seem a trifle too grandiose, it's because British naval architects inadvertently switched the plans with those for a British Embassy in Khartoum. The "single-hand" clock on the north tower is a rare tidal clock set daily to indicate high tide. Today, the meticulously restored complex houses shopping, entertainment and Bermuda's Maritime Museum.

Warmed by the Gulf Stream and ringed by protective coral reefs, Bermuda lies some six hundred miles due east off the coast of North Carolina. A perennially popular cruise destination, Mark Twain called it "the right country for a jaded man to loaf in" and made Bermuda his second home.

Well-tended gardens of hibiscus and oleander frame sherbet-colored cottages in subtle shades of pink, green and peach. Bermuda's first residents were mariners and the signature-coved roofs are adapted from the lapped hulls of wooden ships. There are no rivers on the island and rainwater is collected from the roofs and stored in underground cisterns.

Horse-drawn carriages still meander down Hamilton's Front Street, and afternoon tea is a time-honored tradition. The capital's 18th century Town Hall in Kings Square, overlooks the pillory and stocks once used to publicly chastise gossips and petty offenders.

St. Georges at the opposite end of the island, is the Western Hemisphere's oldest continuously inhabited English-speaking community. In 1609, the Sea Venture, foundered off Bermuda bringing the island's first colonists. Their mishap inspired Shakespeare to pen The Tempest.

Beach lovers will discover that pink is totally your color. Set against a serene turquoise sea, the island's famous pink sand beaches are concentrated around South Shore Park, a coastal reserve with about a dozen coves linked by trails. Beaches range from tiny inlets like Peel Rock Cove, to the blushing sands of secluded Warwick Long Bay along the eastern edge of the park. Horseshoe Bay is a dazzling crescent of sand ranked among the ten best beaches in the world.

Bermuda boasts more golf courses per square mile than any other place on earth. *Port Royal is* a public course characterized by winding fairways skirting coral cliffs and freeform greens set against the sea. The par-3 16th — located just below the ruins of the old Whale Bay Battery — is arguably golf's most scenic hole.

hatham-Kent is Canada's 's unny south' destination for numerous clean, sandy beaches along the shallow shorelines of Lake St. Clair, Lake Erie and two protected bays.

#### **Erieau**

Beachcombers can relax on Erieau beach or enjoy a walk along the narrow pier toward the lighthouse that is surrounded by Lake Erie. The beach area features a park and playground, sand volleyball and barbeque grills along with a scenic pier with a lighthouse. Adventure seekers can rent boats and equipment for water sports. Accommodations and restaurants are also available.

#### Mitchell's Bay

The warm and shallow waters of Mitchell's Bay makes it a popular beach community. You can choose to swim in the bay or cool off at the nearby splash pad and play in the playground. Visitors can extend their time in Mitchell's Bay with an overnight stay at a cabin, campground, cottage or motel.

#### **Provincial Parks**

Rondeau Provincial Park is located off the shores of Lake Erie and is prized for being the largest Carolinian forest in Canada. Located on an 8 km long sand spit extend-

ing into Lake Erie, it's the second oldest provincial park having been established in 1894. Rondeau has been identified as a Canadian Important Bird Area destination and hosts the springtime "Festival of Flight" that attracts birdwatchers from across Canada and the United States.

Campsites are open from April 1st until the last Sunday in October. Sites can accommodate tents, to large trailers and some offer electrical hook-up. Amenities such as water taps, comfort stations and laundry facilities are close by. Hiking trails, swimming, boating and the Park Store are only a short distance away.


Wheatley Provincial Park is Ontario's "deep south" provincial park — at the same latitude as Northern California. The 596-acre park provides an excellent recreational setting for birders, naturalists and campers. Loacted in a secluded coastal estuary, paddlers can navigate two loops through Boosey Creek to Sugar Creek. Campgrounds are situated among a tangle of creeks in a beautifully wooded Carolinian forest setting with a number of creekside campsites.

Visitors are drawn to the picturesque beaches of *Clearville Park*. It offers an abundance of wildlife, sparkling beaches and rare plant species. Anglers can fish for walleye, perch, small mouth bass, salmon and rainbow trout, while hikers can wander wooded nature trails. A quiet, secluded campground is equipped with many amenities, including washrooms, showers and laundry.

ake breezes, tree-lined byways and the summer sun make the drive along the Lake Erie North Shore a trip to remember. Aristotle called wine "light in a bottle" and this is Canada's premier wine country. Participating wineries include *Musce-dere Vineyards*, a family owned and operated winery, which hand-harvests only the finest grapes from their vineyard to produce premium wines producing just 3000 cases a year, on-site. They take great pride in caring for, and nurturing all









aspects of the vineyard and winery, with a relentless enthusiasm for producing fine wines. They believe that wines are made in the vineyard from meticulous vineyard techniques. Small, hand-crafted lots allow them to treat each variety in each vintage with the utmost of attention and care to ensure true varietal character in every wine they release. This commitment to quality is evidenced in their final products and the proof is when you taste their family's wines!

#### **Pelee Island Winery**

EPIC has a special, unique and little-known gem. Out in Lake Erie, you will find the southernmost inhabited place in Canada — Pelee Island. This tiny dot of land is located as far south as northern California, Tuscany and over half of America's 50 states.

Pelee Island is 10,000 acres of idyllic vineyards, farms, beaches, parks and forests. It is also home to the rarest flora and fauna in the country. Species at risk, endangered species and over 10,000 unique plant species inhabit Pelee Island, including the Honey Locust, Hop Tree, Prickly Pear Cactus and Sassafras.

Pelee Island Winery is the largest private estate winery in Canada with a production and event facility in the town of Kingsville and over 700 acres of vineyards on Pelee

Island. Both the mainland winery and island pavilion offer unique tour and tasting experiences.

With heat units and frost-free days unmatched anywhere else in Canada, the island is a natural destination for vinifera grape growing, with 18 varietals alone on Pelee Island.

Pelee Island Winery's staff viticulturalist Bruno Friesen, keeps a careful eye on each and every vine. Bruno monitors the health of the vineyards by utilizing best practices developed in the winery's 10-acre organic farm, and incorporating an integrated pest management protocol. Bruno's commitment to ecologically-responsible pest control and usage of natural island-grown fertilizer are just two ways that Pelee goes above and beyond current industry standards.

Pelee Island Winery President Walter Schmoranz is considered one of Canada's winemaking pioneers and an architect of the Sustainable Winemaking Ontario Program. With the addition of Winemakers Martin Janz and Tim Charisse, Pelee Island Winery has quickly become a leader in Canadian winemaking, winning hundreds of awards around the world. Most recently, Pelee Island Winery was nominated for the LCBO's Best New Product Launch for Lola Sparkling Blush in 2017. This gently sparkling rosé wine has quickly become one of Ontario's most popular VQA wines!

Along with its ecology, Pelee Island also has a rich history. The winery honours this legacy with their *J.S. Hamilton* wines. In 1871, J.S. Hamilton started a grocery and liquor business with Thaddeus Smith of Vin Villa Vineyards, to promote Pelee wines. They then established the Pelee Island Wine and Vineyards Company. One of their most well-known products was *St. Augustine Communion Wine*, purchased by churches in Canada, the United States and Great Britain.

The Pelee Island Wine and Vineyard Company ceased operations in 1916. It wsn't until 1979, that grapes were reintroduced to Pelee Island and today's Pelee Island Winery was established.
