Police Officer Mia Goodwin was killed in the line of duty on December 22, 2021. She was on her fifth day back to work from maternity leave when she was killed in a crash involving a tractor-trailer.

While at the scene of a crash to relieve other officers on Interstate-85 in North Carolina, a tractor-trailer and semi-truck with a trailer collided, crashing into her patrol car and killing her.

Mia attended High Point University in North Carolina where she met her future husband, Brenton, who is a Charlotte firefighter. She leaves behind a 3-year-old child, a 1-year-old child, a 4-month-old baby, and her loving husband.

Mia joined the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department in 2015.
